Day 1

#### • Naples

Day 2

Day 3

#### • Capri

Enjoy another day exploring the stunning coast line along the Island of Capri. Take the opportunity to visit The Blue Cave in Grotta Azzurra, once a roman swimming hole, known for its vibrant and natural blue illumination.



Day 4

#### • Amalfi

Lying at the mouth of a deep gorge and surrounded by spectacular scenery, the town of Amalfi is a stunning sight to behold and a premium cruising destination for some of the world's high rollers. Marvel at the spectacular coastal views from the hillside village of Ravello, where you can explore gorgeous public gardens such as Villa Cimbrone and Villa Rufolo. Later in the day, you can trek Mount Vesuvius for a breathtaking view of the area, where you can see the waters you have cruised the previous day. If you have time, you can also check out the underwater city of Baiae for a completely inverse lost paradise expedition.



Day 6

#### • Ischia

Sail to Ischia, a volcanic spa island with numerous sulfur springs and therapeutic bathing areas. You will find plenty of lounging spots on the beach of this volcanic island that are host to many buzzy bars and restaurants where you can make a pit stop for one last limoncello. Myriad taxis in Ischia can tour the island if you want to stop by some galleries or markets for some lastminute souvenir shopping. They could even take you to Negombo Thermal Gardens, home to aweinspiring nature walks and mineral-rich waters, which are said to have healing powers.
